1) This famous stage actor immediately set about making plans to assassinate President Lincoln when told by John Ford's brother that the President would be attending the play *Our American Cousin* at Ford's Theatre that evening.

2) After the attempt on Seward's life, _____ went to Mary Surratt's boardinghouse. Arriving at the very moment she was being arrested for her part in the assassination. When asked why he was there, carrying a pickaxe, he claimed that he had been hired to dig a gutter.

3) _____ fled with Booth after the assassination and remained with him until Federal Troops surrounded them twelve days later sleeping in Richard Garrett's tobacco barn.

4) This "villainous - looking fellow," lost his nerve and got drunk instead of carrying out his assignment of assassinating Vice President Johnson.

5) _____ was the first woman executed by the United States federal government for her part in the conspiracy to murder the President.

6) Around four o'clock in the morning on April 15, _____ set, splinted and bandaged Booth's broken leg.

7) Booth's long time friend, _____ agreed to become a co-conspirator in the original plot to kidnap President Abraham Lincoln.

8) Carpenter and scene shifter at Ford's Theatre who was convicted as an accomplice to John Wilkes Booth.

9) A Letter from a "friend" named "Sam," discovered by investigators after the assassination. Was found in Booth's hotel room containing information about the original kidnapping plot against Lincoln. This letter helped connect and convict _____ for his role in the conspiracy.
